TITLE: Residential Hamlet Spring Clean Up

EFFECTIVE DATE: MAY 14, 2008

POLICY NUMBER: T.26

Purpose of Policy:

This policy is intended to assist the residents in hamlets with spring yard clean up. The hamlet spring clean up will be offered during the months of May and June in all the municipal communities.

Policy Statements

Removal of Items:

1) The hamlet spring clean up is intended to assist the residents in the removal of large items that would be difficult for the residents to remove for themselves.

2) The MD of Opportunity No. 17 will pick up free of charge the following items:

White Goods (Refrigerators, Stoves etc); Steel Products (Old vehicles, pipe etc.), Furniture; and Large burnable items

- 3) A release and waiver form indicating approval for municipal personnel and equipment to enter private property must be signed by the landowner prior to removal of items.
- 4) Landowners will be responsible to clearly mark the items to be removed.
- 5) The transportation department will then pick up the items (at no cost) during the applicable months (weather permitting).

Landfill Site Hours:

- 6) The landfill hours will change to accommodate residents longer access to the landfill site and transfer sites for the hamlet clean-up program. Regular hours will resume for the month of July and thereafter.
- 7) The deadline for registration/application for the residential hamlet clean up will be June 30, 2008.
- 8) This program is not intended for commercial/industrial clean up.
